The IB program aspires to help schools develop well-rounded students with character who respond to challenges with optimism, are open-minded, are confident in their identities, make ethically correct decisions, join with others in celebrating our common humanity and are prepared to apply what they learn in real-world, complex and unpredictable situations.



IB Learners strive to become inquirers, thinkers, communicators, and risk-takers who are knowledgeable, principled, open-minded, caring, balanced and reflective.

The Prout IB Program invites qualified juniors and seniors to participate in one of two options:

Option 1: Full IB Diploma Candidate

The full diploma candidate will be enrolled in six IB courses from five academic groups. The sixth course will repeat one of the five groups or be chosen from group six. These courses will be a combination of Higher Level (HL) and Standard Level (SL). With the exception of IB Religion, each course is two years and will be taken during junior and senior years.

In addition, full IB diploma candidates also enroll in a Theory of Knowledge course, complete a 4,000 word extended essay, and complete a Creativity, Action, Service (CAS) portfolio.

Candidates who successfully complete the courses, the exams, and all of the additional requirements are eligible to earn the IB Diploma.

Option 2: IB Certificate Candidate

Qualified IB certificate candidates are allowed to enroll in any IB class, with the exception of Theory of Knowledge.
